Today, we were informed that an Old Mission Peninsula School student has been identified as a confirmed positive COVID-19 case. The Health Department and OMPS administration is investigating this case and actively completing contact tracing. If you have not already heard from administration via email or phone call, this case does not currently consider your child to be a close contact.

Due to confidentiality laws and policies, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act, our school and school district are not able to provide specific information regarding any particular case. However, please know that you will be contacted directly by the Health Department if you or your child is a close contact with someone in the school setting who tested positive for COVID-19. The Health Department will advise you on what steps to take.

Families and staff members are reminded to continue to monitor themselves and their children closely for symptoms of COVID-19 illness, which are fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.

We continue to do everything we can to keep our school community safe and appreciate your ongoing support and partnership in this effort. If you have concerns about this matter, we encourage you to contact the Health Department directly.
